- If you usually receive your renewal from the GAC by email and do not receive an email from us on January 1, please check your settings and spam folder.
- If you usually receive your renewal by mail and do not receive anything from us by January 6, please let us know. The best way to contact the membership office is via email at membership@gacemail.org.
- Do not discard your white door/scrip card. There is a \$10 replacement fee. Your 2018 scrip will be loaded onto that card on April 1, 2018.
- All 2017 scrip expires on 2/28/18.

Please note: The GAC operates on a calendar year and depends on the prompt payment of membership dues. Membership renewal is payable on January 1 each year. We allow up to a 60-day grace period to pay. All memberships must be renewed by February 28, 2018. Beginning March 1, there will be a \$100 reinstatement fee added to all renewals.

Irish History Lecture Presented By Dr. Bridget English of University of Illinois at Chicago



Beginning with the nineteenth century notion of an "American wake" — a party thrown for loved ones immigrating to America — this talk will explore the significance of the Irish wake as a point of contact between Irish and American cultures. Presented by Dr. Bridget English,

who holds a PhD in English from Maynooth University in County Kildare, Ireland. Her research interests lie in modern and contemporary Irish fiction and culture, theories of the novel, death studies, modernism, and the medical humanities. She has taught a variety of writing and literature courses at Maynooth University, Brooklyn College of the City University of New York.
