17th Lecture in a Series on Irish History Sunday February 19 from 2-4pm



The GAC Genealogy and Language Groups will host "One half of my heart is Ireland's, and the other half is America's": Irish Immigrants, Nativism, and the Meaning of Loyalty in 19th-century America,

Presented by Ian Delahanty, Ph.D., Assistant Professor of History at Springfield College, whose research and publications examine how Irish immigrants' backgrounds in and connections to Ireland influenced their views on slavery and nationalism in the United States, especially during the American Civil War era.

His talk will examine how Irish immigrants refuted nativists' charges that they were incapable of being loyal Americans, even as they refused to sever economic, political, and cultural ties to their native land.
