Mags Riordan is a guidance counselor turned humanitarian who has built and now runs a medical clinic in the south central African country of Malawi.

Riordan first traveled to Malawi from her native County Kerry nearly 20 years ago, on the anniversary of her son Billy's drowning death

in the impoverished but physically beautiful country. Af-

ter initially considering starting a school in Malawi's Cape Maclear to honor her son's memory, Mags recognized a more pressing need: basic medical care in a land where there is one doctor for every 800,000 people.

Suzanne Strempek Shea is author of *This Is Paradise*, a gripping storing that recounts Riordan's remarkable story of grief, grace and determination.





IRISH HISTORY LECTURE "The Gaelic Idea: Reinventing Irish Dance" Sunday, May 6, 2018 at 2:00 PM

Presented by Sarah Churchill, adjunct professor of Art History at Housatonic Community College, the lecture focuses on Irish dance, a social dance form with humble origins, which today enjoys unprecedented worldwide popularity. With active dance communities in nearly 20 countries, seemingly boundless



merchandising, and countless sophisticated stage production spin-offs, Irish dance is a global industry whose gross profit is almost incalculable. This lecture traces the development of Irish dancing, from the earliest days to the post-Riverdance boom, considering the ways in which the aesthetics of dancing and its purpose in Irish social life have changed over the course of its history, reflecting wider changes in Ireland itself.
