GAC MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL 2018

If you have a working email on file with us, you will receive notification on Jan 1 to renew your GAC membership for 2018. If you have no email or have requested paper billing, your invoice will arrive in the mail after December 28th.

For the first time, we are offering a special incentive to the first 250 members who renew for 2018. At the monthly membership meeting in February, we will draw 3 names from the first 250 renewals and those members will receive a free membership for 2018. (This does not include scrip).

Other important information regarding membership renewal:

- Please make sure your contact information, especially email and home address are current. You can log into your account to review your information at any time. https://www.gaelicamericanclub.com/
- If you usually receive your renewal from the GAC by email and do not receive an email from us on January 1, please check your settings and spam folder.
- If you usually receive your renewal by mail and do not receive anything from us by January 6, please let us know. The best way to contact the membership office is via email at membership@gacemail.org.
- Do not discard your white door/scrip card. There is a \$10 replacement fee. Your 2018 scrip will be loaded onto that card on April 1, 2018.
- All 2017 scrip expires on 2/28/18.

Please note: The Gaelic American Club operates on a calendar year and depends on the prompt payment of membership dues. Membership renewal is payable on January 1 each year. We allow up to a 60-day grace period to pay. All memberships must be renewed by February 28, 2018. Beginning March 1, there will be a \$100 reinstatement fee added to all renewals.

DYING THE GOOD DEATH: THE IRISH WAKE AND AMERICAN POPULAR CULTURE Sunday, Feb 18 from 2pm - 4pm Irish History Lecture Presented By Dr. Bridget English of University of Illinois at Chicago

Beginning with the nineteenth century notion of an "American wake"--a party thrown for loved ones immigrating to America--this talk will explore the significance of the Irish wake as a point of contact between Irish and American cultures. The Irish wake was traditionally a site of liminality at which point the living and the dead could intermingle and inhabit the same space. Literary and cultural depictions enforce this magical quality to the wake, focusing on its wild, primitive and uncontrollable aspects.
