Purpose: Notice to appear in the monthly newsletter. Notice Change to 2019 Annual Member Dues, Script and Initiation fees

At the October Monthly Membership meeting the Executive Committee recommended an increase in Annual Dues and Script. A motion to increase the new member Initiation fee was also made from the floor.

Since the last increase in membership fees in the 1990s the club has grown significantly. Membership has grown from hundreds of members to a club of 6,000 members with a waitlist of new applicants. The club facilities have also expanded significantly nearly doubling the physical building footprint. With this growth there has been many positive changes for the GAC community with expanded programs and services for members.

The growth of the club also comes with the additional cost of operations. As we celebrate the 25th year in the current club location the building is starting to show its age. A recent evaluation by the Facilities Committee estimated more than \$250,000 of maintenance requirements over the next two years including new roofs, windows and HVAC equipment. All of which have a typical lifespan of 25 years.

Currently the club does not operate with a cash reserve or the necessary financial safeguards for unexpected events. In the last year we've had significant pipes burst and the basement flood. Since insurance doesn't cover everything these types of unexpected events can have a impact on the financial health of the GAC. Therefore, once the immediate building repairs are addressed we intend to use an increasing percentage of the revenue generated from membership dues to establish a financial reserve for the club. This reserve will also be used to fund a Capital Projects fund to address building maintenance early before small issues become large and expensive projects.

As presented to the membership at the October 2018 monthly meeting the Executive Committee is recommending the following changes to membership Dues, Scrip and Initiation fees.

The proposed changes to the 2019 membership fees are as follows:

- Senior (1): Dues: \$30 Scrip: \$75 Assessment: \$0 Total: \$105
- Senior (2): Dues: \$60 Scrip: \$150 Assessment: \$0 Total: \$210
- Individual: Dues: \$60 Scrip: \$75 Assessment: \$40 Total: \$175
- Senior + Individual Dues: \$90 Scrip: \$150 Assessment: \$40 Total:
- Family (1 Adult and children under 21): Dues: \$60 Scrip: \$75 Assessment: \$40 Total: \$175
- Family (2 Adults with or without children under 21): Dues: \$120 Scrip: \$150 Assessment: \$80 Total: \$350
- New Member Initiation: \$150

Please note that a motion was made at the October meeting and passed to raise the initiation fee from \$100 to \$150. Since this increase can be interpreted to be "other monetary requirements of membership" per section 4.2 of the Bylaws it will be proposed again for good order.

The Final vote on all 2019 member related fees to take place at the November 9th Monthly Membership Meeting.


