For the first time ever in the 70 year history of the club at GAC, an effort is underway to put on an a "Variety Show in Irish" (session style). 2018 is the Year of the Irish Language and we would like to show that the club actively participated in that. It will be open to the public (\$5/person) and a booklet will be published ahead of time with each performance piece in English as well as Irish, so everyone can understand the show on the day.


This lecture will discuss the Celtic cross quarter days: Samhain, Imbolc, Beltane, and Lughnasadh.


succession of inspirational educators, living in the native speaking Conamara Gaeltacht and her honors degree in Irish and Translation Studies.

Answer forum and reception. The event will run from 2:30-4:30 and is open to all Free of charge.


VIDEOGRAPHERS NEEDED FOR ORAL HISTORY VIDEO PROJECT
