Labor & Dignity: James Connolly in America Thursday, April 3rd - Sunday, April 6th

An exhibition of James Connolly, which had its world premiere at the Consulate General of Ireland in November, will be hosted by the 100th Anniversary Easter Rising Committee at the GAC. John Connolly, Irish national icon, was a signatory of the Proclamation of the Irish Republic for which he was executed by a British Army firing squad. He was also an internationally known labor leader. In Dublin he formed his Irish Citizen Army organized to protect workers from anti-labor police and strike breakers. Connolly led the Citizen Army into the Easter Rising in 1916.

The exhibition will be held Thursday, April 3, 6-9 pm; Friday, April 4, 6-10 pm; Saturday, April 5, 6-10 pm; and Sunday, April 6 from 11:30 am to 2:30 pm and 4:15 to 7 pm.
