Proposed Policy & Procedure Change *

A policy change was proposed at the Membership Meeting on May 9th and will be brought to the floor for consideration at the Membership Meeting on June 6th. At that time, it may be discussed, withdrawn, amended, or adopted by a majority of those present and voting. The proposed change is the ADDITION of an Elections Code of Conduct, which follows.

ELECTIONS CODE OF CONDUCT

The Elections Committee shall be charged with conducting a fair, honest, and efficient election.

The Elections Committee shall be responsible for opening and closing the polling place, enforcing the Elections Code, maintaining accurate records of voting, staffing the poll site, and preparing and publishing all notices in connection with the election.


Each member of the Elections Committee shall be required to sign a Code of Conduct agreeing to remain neutral and not promote any candidates in any way, i.e., through phone calls, emails, or "voter cards", commencing with their appointment to the Committee until the final results are announced at the conclusion of voting.

All candidates for office must sign an agreement stating that they will conduct themselves in a manner that facilitates an honest, fair, and efficient election. Candidates agree to refrain from personal attacks upon any candidates or members of their family, or conduct any campaigning using the Gaelic American Club name or any GAC media for their personal campaign. Further, candidates will refrain from campaigning in the immediate area of the polling place and will keep a respectable distance from the voting machines and shall not linger in the lobby except to cast their own vote. Candidates shall not gather in the Carolan Room, the lobby, or the vestibule. These rules shall apply to all candidates including, the President of the Executive Committee, if running for another term, unless called upon to cast a vote to break a tie.
