Important Message to Membership

Protect **OUR** Club. Sign in each of **YOUR** guests. State liquor control laws mandate that private clubs maintain a guestbook.

Non-member guests are required to sign the guestbook and be signed in by a Club member. Failure to comply with the liquor laws may result in fines or other penalties such as closure of our pub for a period of time determined by the Liquor Control Commission. The member is responsible for the conduct of their guest and the guest must leave the Club when the member leaves. There are **NO** exceptions.

Procedure for the Guestbook:

- 1) Member **PRINTS** member name for **EACH** guest.
- 2) **EACH** guest writes their own name and address.

It's as easy as that!! It takes a few seconds, that's all. No big deal. Your 'child' over 21yrs old is a **GUEST** unless they have their own member. One cannot sign the book for someone else. Dittos are NOT allowed in the book. Limit of 4 guests per member at any one time.

For the next few months (at least) ALL members (not just the member who gets the door to open) will be asked to show their card when coming into the GAC - just hold it up or sign in as a guest (again, **NO EXCEPTIONS**). **Each** member over 21 is issued their own card - please have it with you or you will be asked to sign in as a guest.

Please be respectful of the Failte volunteers. They care about OUR Club and are just doing their job. Volunteers always welcome -Thank you!

"PASTURE TO PAVEMENT"
SUNDAY, MAY 5, 2019 - 2 PM
 This lecture presented by Hilary Mhic Suibhne, explores the parallels and intersections in the lives of working-class Irish and urban work horses in 19th century New York City.

This talk will trace the role of horses in Irish culture and how the lives of the living four-legged machines of New York City and those of poor Irish immigrants, whose labor was central to the development of the city, revolved around one other.

Hilary was educated at University College Dublin and at New York University. She currently teaches Irish language at New York University NYC and is External Examiner in Irish at Vassar College. In addition to publishing many journal and periodical articles and essays, she has co-edited and co-translated a collection of 32 essays written in Irish by the late Barra Ó Donnabháin.
