

IRISH HISTORY LECTURE

"Irish Need Not Apply. Retracing the Footsteps of Our Irish Ancestors" with Dr. Christine Kinealy Sunday, October 27, 2019 – 2:00 p.m.



Presented by Dr. Kinealy who was educated at Trinity College Dublin. She is an author and authority on Irish History. She is the founding director of Ireland's Great Hunger Institute at Quinnipiac University. Dr. Kinealy is considered "one of the most influential Irish Americans" (Irish American Magazine, 2011).

The lecture will examine the push and pull factors that led

people to leave Ireland and will explore the multiple challenges that they faced if they did emigrate. These challenges included death on route, or deportation upon arrival, and prejudice summed up in the adage, 'Irish Need Not Apply'.
