



If you have a working email on file with us, you will receive notification on Jan 1 to renew your GAC membership for 2020. If you have no email or have requested paper billing, your invoice will arrive in the mail after December 28th.

Other important information regarding membership renewal:

- Please make sure your contact information, especially email and home address are current. You can log into your account to review your information: www.gaelicamericanclub.com.
- If you usually receive your renewal from the GAC by email and do not receive an email from us on January 1, please check your settings and spam folder.
- If you usually receive your renewal by mail and do not receive anything from us by January 6, please let us know. The best way to contact the membership office is via email at membership@gacemail.org.
- Do not discard your white door/scrip card. There is a \$10 replacement fee. Your 2020 scrip will be loaded onto that card on April 1, 2020.
- All 2019 scrip expires on 2/29/20.

CLAN NA GAEL NEWS



Dear Fellow Members,

This is to bring you up to date on the various happenings at your Club.

We had a bit of excitement earlier this month when a drainage pipe split causing a major back-up. We had the rotorooter guys in and they were able to clear the blockage. That still left the damaged pipe however. We explored a number of repair options including a new "balloon" technology. The technology similar to a stent, involved the use of a felt sleeve impregnated with a resin which when inserted into a pipe and inflated hardened forming a patch at the site of the break. Unfortunately, because of a bend in the pipe before the break which was 120 feet in, the technology could not be used. We then turned to Pat Maher for his expertise. He and his associate Pat O'Driscol sliced out a very precise area of the tile floor, cut through the cement cap and dug down seven feet to reach the break. The repaired pipe is now better than new, the cement cap replaced and a new drain for easier future access has been installed.

Fortunately, we had no surprises with the financial condition of the Club and we experienced a milestone. As many of you will recall, we took out a \$1,400,000.00 mortgage to fund the 2009 expansion of the Club. By the end of October we had paid off \$1,000,000.00 of the mortgage and the balance now stands at \$393, 341.56. We continue to pay down the loan at an accelerated rate. We have improved our cash position from this time last year by over \$100,000.00. In addition to budgeting for all anticipated maintenance, repairs and improvements for next year, we have funded a capital account to cover any emergencies such as the one we just experienced. You will be pleased to know that there are no increases in prices or dues in the budget for next year.

Turning to the cultural situation at the Club, I can report that we continue to have full houses at our events. The appearance of the Andy Cooney Band is a case in point. We introduced cabaret seating and served dinner in the Carolan room prior to the performance. Folks came in, had dinner and stayed for the evening.

On Sunday November 10th is another example of the diverse events we offer. We started off the day with a Mass at 10AM for our deceased members. It was quite moving as different members shared aloud the names of those members who had passed and we all remembered them. One could feel the living history of the Club.

That afternoon, the Irish Clubs of Fairfield Prep and Laurelton Hall co-hosted their annual musical-charity fundraiser for Ireland's largest international aid organization, "Trocaire" which means "compassion" in Gaelic. The young men and women raised more than \$1,800.00 for this year's "Trad for Trocaire". Music was provided by the traditional Irish band Ceol Agus Craic, We were also treated to a traditional Irish music performance by the four children of Liz and John Feeney. What I found was particularly inspiring was that they were all taught to play their instruments by members of the Shamrogues. That is called generational pay back. Members of the Lenihan School of Irish Dance also gave a fabulous performance.

Following the Trad, we had the annual Hanging of Jerseys presided over by Noreen Forde with music provided by Camac The jerseys of the winners of last year's All Ireland Finals in Hurling and Irish Football were taken down and replaced. This year's winners were Tipperary for hurling and Dublin for Irish football.

Hurling is believed to have come to Ireland with the Celts and predates the arrival of Christianity. Watching the game you can well believe it. The rules were finally written down by the GAA in 1884 at the Hayes Hotel in Thurles, Tipperary. The first All-Ireland Hurling final was played in 1891 with Kerry beating Wexford. The first All-Ireland Final in Irish Football was played in 1887 with Limerick showing off Louth.

We are planning a tree lighting and caroling event on December 11th at 7 PM. Weather permitting, we will start in the side yard. In addition to hot chocolates and hot apple cider for the kids, hot buttered rum will be featured by the bar. Speaking of the side yard, we plan to add a fire pit and a horseshoe pitch next spring.

As you know in keeping with the "G" in the GAC, we strive to preserve and pass on our Irish traditions. Having Irish born members adds a certain dimension to our efforts that can't be duplicated. Irish emigration is in decline however as is the percentage of our Irish born members. I keep in touch with the folks at the Irish Consulate and I have recently reached out to them on this issue.
