If you have a working email on file with us, you received notification on January 1 to renew your GAC membership for 2020. If you have no email or have requested paper billing, your invoice was mailed in late December.

# Other important information regarding membership renewal:

- Please make sure your contact information, especially email and home address are current. You can log into your account to review your information at any time. https://www.gaelicamericanclub.com/
- If you usually receive your renewal from the GAC by email and did not receive an email from us on January 1st, please check your settings and spam folder.
- If you usually receive your renewal by mail and do not receive anything from us by January 6, please let us know. The best way to contact the membership office is via email at membership@gacemail.org.
- Do not discard your white door/scrip card. There is a \$10 replacement fee. Your 2020 scrip will be loaded onto that card on April 1, 2020.
- All 2019 scrip expires on February 29, 2020.

Please note: The Gaelic American Club operates on a calendar year and depends on the prompt payment of membership dues. Membership renewal is payable on January 1 each year. We allow up to a 60-day grace period to pay. All memberships must be renewed by February 29, 2020. Beginning March 1, there will be a \$100 reinstatement fee added to all renewals.

### Dear Members,

First of all I want to thank you for coming out to vote for the candidates in the December elections. I was reelected by the vote of 5% of the membership. I take this as a mandate.

Consistent with the percentage of voter turn-out, we didn't have a quorum at the December meeting, As you may know, a minimum of 40 members or a bit less than one percent of the membership is required to be in attendance in order to hold the meeting. As we typically have more than 4 times as many members in the pub and restaurant as in the meeting, we have opened the bar in the meeting room. I absolutely draw the line however at showing the Friday night games in there as well

Since no reports could be given, I want to bring you up to date on where we are. We are closing the book on another good year.

After taking into account that we have not yet spent all of the money set out in the 2019 budget because many of the projects have come in under budget, our cash position at the end of November was \$214,000.00 versus \$134,000.00 this time last year and our net profit is also up from last year.

We have negotiated and signed the Elevator Repair and Maintenance Contracts with Kone; the manufacturer.

We have determined the redesign solution for the basement floor to address the periodic hydrostatic flooding we experience because of the high water table in this area of Fairfield.

We are in the process of repainting the white lines in the parking lot and creating 6 new handicapped parking spaces. We have installed a new high powered glass washer. There are some down sides to the change. This means that you will no longer be able to guess who had the glass before you from the trace shade of lipstick on the glass. This also means if anyone returns home with lipstick that shouldn't have been there, they can no longer blame the glasses at the Club. That being said, the glasses have always been thoroughly cleaned but the previous washer just couldn't remove all traces of lipstick.

We have arranged for defibrillator training by the Fire Department for all members of the staff. As you may know a defibrillator is kept at the front desk. A notice of the date will be sent out in case any members wish to attend. We have repaired the roof, replaced all the windows and window curtains. For all those who felt seasick using the top tables in the pub, we have stabilized the ones we could and the replacement for the one we couldn't, is awaiting delivery. All carpets were professionally cleaned this week.



As far as social events were concerned, I can report that the Tree Lighting and Caroling along with hot buttered rum and the spiked and unspiked hot apple cider and eggnog was an outstanding success.

You can't beat the annual St. Pat's Dinner Dance for a fabulous evening and this year was no exception.

As you can see from a recent photo of a meeting of the Fairfield Garden Club in the pub, our facilities continue to be well patronized. One clue that may break the code, most of these boyos who are all long time members of the Club have never touched a rake or hoe in their

lives and wouldn't know a kumquat from a cucumber.
