HOW AND WHY TO READ THE WORLD'S GREATEST NOVEL The 29th Lecture in a Series of Lectures on Irish History Our February presenter will be Dr. Abby Bender, Depart-



ment of Languages and Literatures, and Director of the Minor in Irish Studies at Sacred Heart University. Dr. Bender's research is focused on Irish literature and culture, and she is the author of Israelites in Erin: Exodus, Revolution, and the Irish Revival (Syracuse UP, 2015), as well as essays on James Joyce, Lady Grego-

ry, Patrick Pearse, the Irish Revival, and transnationalism.

Dr. Bender's current book project is a cultural and literary history of breastfeeding in Ireland, a topic that has led into further considerations of the body, biopower, disability, and medical humanities, with a particular focus on gender and women's writing. She continues to be interested in questions of transnational analogy, and her current work in Jewish-Irish studies addresses both historical and contemporary issues of solidarity, migration, and borders. If you have a working email on file with us, you received notification in January to renew your GAC membership for 2023.

If you have no email or have requested paper billing, your invoice was mailed in late December. Other important information regarding membership renewal:

- Please make sure your contact information, especially email and home address are current. You can log into your account to review your information at any time on the GAC membership website https://www.gaelicamericanclub.com/
- If you usually receive your renewal from the GAC by email and did not receive an email from us by January 3rd, please check your settings and spam folder.
- If you usually receive your renewal by mail and do not receive anything from us by January 6, please let us know. The best way to contact the membership office is via email at membership@gacemail.org.
- Do not discard your white door/scrip card. There is a \$10 replacement fee. Your 2023 scrip will be loaded onto that card on April 1, 2023.
- All 2022 scrip expires on February 28, 2023. You can contact membership committee via email at membership@gacemail.org

Please note: The Gaelic American Club operates on a calendar year and depends on the prompt payment of membership dues. Membership renewal is payable beginning on January 1 each year. We allow up to a 60-day grace period to pay. All memberships must be renewed by February 28, 2023. Beginning March 1, there will be a \$100 reinstatement fee added to all unpaid accounts.
