PRICE INCREASES

Over the past year we have experienced increased cost of goods and supplies due to Covid and the challenging supply chain . Unfortunately, we have had to raise the prices at the pub to keep pace with increases and to maintain a sufficient income to properly maintain the club operations. Please note that we have not increased prices in over 4 years.

Liquor cocktails have increased by 50 cents and bottled beers have been increased by 25 cents. Wine and draught beer prices have not increased at this time. Thank you for your understanding.

USE OF SCRIP

Scrip was created as a means for members to purchase in-club food, beverages and events. In the summer of 2020, during the height of the pandemic scrip became an accepted form of payment on takeout orders only because cash transactions were suspended due to COVID Health precautions. Now that cash is once again being used, the GAC is going back to the original policy and will no longer accept scrip for payment of takeout.


