

JERRY O'SULLIVAN FRIDAY JUNE 2ND FROM 6-8PM



Jerry O'Sullivan is June's first Friday Trad Musician and has been widely hailed as America's premier uilleann piper. His reputation for technical and melodic mastery of the instrument, an Irish bagpipe known for its subtlety and expression, is unsurpassed in the United States, and is demanding considerable attention overseas. Jerry is widely recorded on the tin whistle, the low whistle, the Highland Pipes and the Scottish small pipes.
