IRISH HISTORY LECTURE - SUNDAY FEB 4 @ 2PM



Professor Brendan Kane will be our guest lecturer on February 4, 2024 at 2:00 p.m. in the Carolan Room. Dr. Kane is from Reading, Pennsylvania, received a B.A. in history from the University of Rochester, an M.Phil in Irish Studies from the National University of Ireland, Galway, and a PhD from Princeton. Prior to coming to UCONN in 2005, he spent a year as the NEH/Keough Fellow at the Universi-

ty of Notre Dame's Keough Institute of Irish Studies. He serves as Vice-President/President-elect of the Celtic Studies Association of North America, elected Council Member of the North American Conference on British Studies, and co-director of the digital humanities project Léamh.org.

He will lecture on Irish Bardic Poets and the Wider World, c. 1500-1650 considering the place of the Irish bardic poet in European context during the age of the Renaissance and Reformation. His talk will address some of the latest research on the Irish bardic poet in Continental context and will draw upon both Irish-language poetry and prose. It will aim to suggest some ways in which early modern Ireland might look a bit more European than expected and, conversely, how Europe might look a bit more Irish!

ONE ACT PLAYWRITING CONTEST

The Clan Na Gael sponsored One Act Playwriting Contest has returned. This contest strives to support and encourage emerging playwrights and to provide a stage for scripts that might not otherwise find one. Playwrights of all ages are encouraged to enter.

The contest is seeking original One Act plays of not less than 15 mins and not more than 30 minutes in length and must be the original writing of the submitting playwright. Scripts are restricted to plays that have not been produced, published or won other contests. Submissions to this contest must have an Irish theme. Playwrights under the age of 18 must have their guardian's permission to submit their play. One script per playwright accepted each contest year.

This is our 9th contest. It runs from June 1st thru August 1st, 2024. All entries must be submitted by email no later than August 1st, 2024 to be considered.

For the first time, monetary prizes will be rewarded for the three winning plays, \$200.00 for 1st place, \$100.00 for 2nd place and \$50.00 for 3rd place. The winners will also receive a staged reading of their play at the Gaelic American Club in 2024.
