Now that the summer is over GAC's monthly Senior Lunch and weekly Set Dancing sessions are back on the calendar.


We are always looking for volunteers for all the committees. If you are interested, please reach out and we can connect you with the chairperson. It is a great opportunity to meet members and help the club.
